Chairman's Report



Following the past years of life affected by Covid e.g. lockdowns, restricted movement etc we finally managed to slowly return to pre-Covid activity. Our volunteers and patients still wore masks and sanitised hands but by the end of the year this became unnecessary.

On 30th June 2022 the Greater Manchester Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCG's) were abolished, and responsibility was transferred to the Greater Manchester Integrated Care Board (ICB). The effect on the Charity is instead of requesting funding from 10 x CCG's we now deal solely with one commissioner for the whole of Greater Manchester. We have received assurances that our funding will remain until March 2025.

Our service to children and parents/carers concluded this year in 740 children being taken on 4,442 journeys to health appointments covering 88,633 miles in the process. On behalf of the Board of Trustees, I wish to thank all our volunteers and staff for their dedication and diligence in achieving this result. The way we conduct our business affects our reputation which is held in high regard by people whom we come into contact.

We welcome new volunteers Peter Roberts, Helen Burke, Paul Horrocks, Roger Burgess and Ursula Cross.

We hope they have a long and fulfilling period of volunteering with us and that they can be proud of the good their commitment to improving the lives and health of children.

Sadly during the year, we lost Pamela Barnes and Brian Ward. May they rest in peace.

Who we are and what we do

Transport for Sick Children (TfSC) is a charity which operates a volunteer driver scheme. Our team of volunteers drive sick children to hospital appointments throughout Greater Manchester. Our mission is to reduce stress and barriers to a family by enabling children to attend important medical appointments despite any transport, financial or social issues they have.

Over the past 10 years we have helped over 10,000 children, undertaken 60,000 trips and driven over 1,200,000 miles.


Volunteer drivers (who are all checked for their suitability to work with children) use their own cars to collect the child along with their carer and drive them to their medical appointment. They then wait until the appointment has finished and take them home. Some drivers are out on the road most days and others a few times a month. We supply child car seats and drivers are reimbursed for petrol costs on a monthly basis.

Making the vital link between families, referrers and volunteer drivers is a friendly, experienced team in the office. The Support team assigns drivers to appointments and co-ordinates communication between drivers and carers to ensure trips run smoothly.

What is it like being a volunteer?

'Volunteering is so important. I wanted to do something different when I retired (I was a Bank Manager for a number of years). I heard about Transport for Sick Children and got involved. I'm now a volunteer driver, driver representative and Trustee for the charity. The role is flexible and I enjoy transporting and getting to know the families. It keeps me busy and is good for my mental health.'

What do people say about us...

'My name is Dasha Chemo, and I am a Senior Child Counsellor at St. Marys SARC. We work with highly traumatised adults, children, young people and families who have experienced sexual abuse and found themselves in challenging positions in their lives.

We've been working with Transport for Sick Children for a few years now and we wouldn't be able to provide therapeutic treatment to many families/ children without this charity support. I personally find this organisation very helpful because of their prompt responses, empathic approach, and kindness. I often hear gratitude from the parents of our patients for being transported to their treatment, as otherwise, they wouldn't be able to access help at all. Therapy is a very painful process that can be tiring, and Transport for Sick Children provides care, compassion, containment, safety and understanding before and after the treatment. All my interactions with the staff have always been professional and kind. I want to thank everyone working for the Transport For Sick Children Charity for making our world kinder and safer.'

Pamela Barnes

In April, we were very saddened to hear of the death of Pamela Barnes following a stroke. Pamela was instrumental in starting Transport for Sick Children by asking Sally Carroll to arrange transport for a struggling family from Northern Moor to Wythenshawe Hospital over several weeks in 1977. Sally and Pam were members of the local branch of Action for Sick Children, formerly NAWCH.

Her intervention with this family prevented two little girls from being taken into care or needing repeated hospital admissions. Pam identified the need for and importance of transport for this family and the service grew from here with TfSC becoming a charity in 1994. Pamela was an Advisor at the Department of Health on national standards pertaining to the welfare of children and she lectured nationally and internationally on the needs of sick children and their families. She was awarded an Honorary Fellowship of the Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health in recognition of her work in the sector in 2012 and awarded an MBE for services to children's health and education in 2013. May Pamela rest in peace.

Treasurer's report

Financial review



The Charity's Incoming Resources totalled £162,093 (last year £149,876) in the twelve months to 31st March 2023. The sources of income were as follows:

Donations totalled £10,089 from CAF, Vernon Building Society, Guides Belle Vue, Masonic Charity Fund and Pure Innovations. It, again, also includes several donations from our Volunteer Drivers. Interest rates have increased during the year resulting in around £1,400 of investment income. The Charity's need to retain liquidity has precluded long term investment, i.e. one year or more, because of income uncertainty due to changes in health care budgets and the requirement to ensure sufficient, ongoing operational funding.

Expenditure has also continued to be well controlled and is reviewed at every Board meeting. Key changes in the year compared to 2022 are:



The charity has made a surplus of £4,217 compared with last year of £7,965. There has been an increase in mileage costs to reflect the rate change due to increased fuel costs and activity during the year.

Employment costs also increased in line with the NHS Agenda for Change published pay scales for all staff. The charity has increased spending around publicity and promotion in order to recruit more volunteer drivers, this has been desperately needed and will continue into next year.



No further spend has been allocated from the £26,168 restricted funds for the Heywood, Middleton and Rochdale area for project development and administrative costs. In order to make best use of this funding, which is outside and additional to our service contract, work commenced to undertake a travel training project for older children, so they can become more independent for certain journeys. Whilst the preliminary work was encouraging the impact of Covid-19 has resulted in a pause in this proposed activity. The Board will review this during 2023/24.
